The Town of Binghamton is once again applying for a **Community Development Block Grant.** You may have heard about this highly successful grant program that we've taken advantage of in the past. This program has enabled many Town residents to have necessary repairs done on their homes. Specifically, the grant funds can be used to rehabilitate single-family, owner-occupied properties located in the Town of Binghamton. Occupants must be low-to-moderate in income and the property must be in need of repairs. The type of rehabilitation work includes, but may not be limited to: electrical, plumbing, heating, roofing, insulation, masonry, windows, doors, painting, flooring, and interior and exterior carpentry. This is a grant, not a loan. If you would like to request a pre-application and be placed on the waiting list for potential future funding, please call Thoma Development Consultants at (607) 753-1433, Monday through Friday, between 8:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. I hope some of you take advantage of this great opportunity!

Summer is here, and we are deep into our to-do list. The roads that we had slated to pave have been paved. Many of the ditches have been cleaned, and we have completed one circuit of mowing. But . . . we will not rest until all of the list is complete.

We have two rounds of roads we intend to chip seal, two bridges that need preventative maintenance, and for some reason that grass on the sides of the roads just continues to grow! I ask one very important thing. While you're out driving our roads, please keep an eve out for work crews. Slow down, obey the flaggers, and be mindful of the equipment and the workers.

As usual, if you're planning any projects around your house where you need to dig, please call 811 (UDigNY) and file a work plan so we know to come and mark your underground facilities. Calling 811 ensures that nothing gets damaged and you don't get hurt.




This problem has made us rethink how to contact you, not only for flushing notices, but for water breaks, and for the possibility of emailing your bills in the future! We're thinking a mass email service is the best, so we need to begin collecting your email addresses.

If you live in a water and/or sewer district, we're asking you to please send your email contact information to us. In the subject line, write: HERE'S MY

EMAIL. We'll need your name, house address, and of course, email address. It may also be helpful to have your water/sewer acct. #, if you have it handy. Please send to: water@townofbinghamton.com EMAIL

This process may take some time, but in the end, we think it will be worth it. Thanks for your help!

November 1st (1st billing of a cycle); due in early December February 1st (2nd billing); due in early March May 1st (3rd billing); due in early June

August 1st (4th billing); due in early September

IMPORTANT NOTE: If the August bill is not paid in full by October 15th, the unpaid amount is turned over to the Broome County Real Property Tax Office as unpaid and will be relevied onto next January's Town & County tax bill. Summer is the busiest season for our department. Building projects are always in full swing, and it's also the time of year when people are wanting to clean up their unwanted junk, including old vehicles. Here's some information I thought you might find helpful:

- BUILDING PERMITS Building Permits are required for most projects, including sheds, pools, decks, porches, additions, pole barns, garages, houses, political signs, cellular towers, TV towers, and now, house generators and solar related projects. Please call our office before starting any project so that we can fill you in on any rules and regulations. If you don't have time for a call, go to our page on the Town's website to get most of your questions answered. Also, feel free to contact us via email if you have any questions. You're also more than welcome to submit your building permit application via email. Our email addresses are listed above.
- **JUNK VEHICLES** If you have a junk vehicle that you want to get rid of, the best and easiest way is to call *Gary's U-Pull It* at (607) 775-1900. They'll pick your vehicle up or you can drop it off at their location at 230 Colesville Road. If they pick it up, they'll deduct a towing fee from the price they'll give you. Car pricing is based upon the make, model, condition, and weight of the vehicle. A car can generally bring anywhere from \$200 to \$600. Call *Gary's U-Pull It* if you have questions.
- **MUNICIPAL CLEANUP DAYS** will be held for the second time this year in September. Here are some details. This is a great opportunity to get rid of your junk for free!

CAR BATTERIES

WHITE GOODS (washers, dryers, water heaters, stoves, microwaves, etc.)



The Binghamton Town Court is part of the independent Judicial Branch of New York State government and plays a vital role in the Unified Court System of New York



In the civil part, the Town Court hears litigant actions seeking money judgment awards up to \$3,000 in more relaxed small claims part proceedings. The court also hears landlord/tenant matters that may result in an eviction, an unlimited monetary judgment for back rent that is due, or a court order mandating property repair.

The Town Justice is authorized to conduct civil marriage solemnizations.

In the **criminal part**, the court is authorized to fully adjudicate matters involving the prosecution of misdemeanors and violations that are committed within the town's geographic boundaries.

This Town Court has preliminary felony jurisdiction, and the Town Justice presides in the Broome County Central Arraignment Part on a rotational basis.

The Court hears Vehicle and Traffic Law misdemeanors and traffic infractions.

Jury and non-jury trials are held in the Town Courtroom on an as-needed basis.

The Court Clerk is responsible for maintaining all court-related records and calendars.

The Town Justice is an elected official with a four-year term that must annually complete twelve (12) hours of mandatory Judicial Continuing Education offered by the State Office of Court Administration. The Justice is subject to the canons of Judicial Ethics.

BROOME COUNTY LANDFILL'S HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION DATES

The BC Landfill is once again accepting hazardous waste (including household and auto batteries, propane tanks, fluorescent bulbs, driveway sealers, paints, solvents, stains, cleaners, pesticides, and pool and photography chemicals) AND old electronics (such as computers, printers, stereos, TVs, copiers, fax machines, mobile phones, etc.). You can drop these off at the landfill for FREE on the following days from 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.:

News from County Legislator Kelly Wildoner - Summer 2024



I hope everyone has been staying cool during this very hot summer. I wanted to give an update on some things going on in the Town of Binghamton and our community.

The Broome County Land Bank is an essential partnership we have at the County. They do great work renovating or demolishing eye sores in our community. In the Town of Binghamton, a number of years ago, the Land Bank, in partnership with the Legislature, renovated a home on Burdick Road so that it could be sold to someone in our community and returned to the tax rolls.

The Land Bank's Affordable Homes Program is a great way to address dilapidated properties in our community and give someone the chance to turn the property into a home. The Land Bank also works on demolitions for properties that are too long gone, to help clean up our neighborhoods. A property on Margery Street, in the Park Terrace area, was demolished thanks to help from the Land Bank and the Legislature. Keeping our neighborhoods clean and safe for families is a top priority.

In my last column, I touched on the new Veterans Resource Center that will be located at 530 State Street in Binghamton. This Resource Center will be great for all of our Veterans in Broome County. Additionally, in May, the Legislature held its 14th annual *Veterans of Distinction Ceremony*. This is a ceremony we hold at our May Legislative Session meeting to recognize the great Veterans in our area. It truly is a ceremony I look forward to each year, and it's such a great way to honor the brave men and women who served their country and community. Thank you to everyone who participated. I'm excited for next year's ceremony.

Summertime is the perfect time to take advantage of all our County Parks. There are a number of great parks to visit in the County, including Aqua Terra Wilderness Area, which is perfect for hiking and fishing. I wanted to also remind everyone of the family fun events the County is hosting this summer. As I talked about last time, the Spiedie Fest will be celebrating its 40^{th} anniversary. Be sure to get a ticket and stop down at Otsiningo Park August $2^{nd} - 4^{th}$ to experience the fun.

Broome County Department of Public Works Highway Division will be resurfacing and paving 5½ miles of Powers Road, running through the Town of Binghamton and Conklin. Please keep an eye out as this may affect your travels.

DOG SHELTER LAW PROTECTS DOGS DURING THE DOG DAYS OF SUMMER!



The Dog Shelter Law is a law that applies to all seasons, including summer. Section 353-B of the New York Agriculture and Markets Law requires dog owners to provide shelter for their dogs. The shelter must protect your dog from direct sunlight, rain, snow, wind, cold weather, hot weather, and other inclement conditions. The shelter must be waterproof, insulated, and allow the dog to move around freely. The dog must be able to stand up, turn around, and lie down. Violators will receive a court citation and be required to pay a fine ranging from \$50 to \$250 and will need to show proof of shelter for the dog. If you suspect that someone is not providing their dog with adequate food

and/or shelter, call the Sheriff's Dept. at (607) 778-1911 and press 1 to speak with a Deputy or call the New York State Police at (607) 775-1241.
