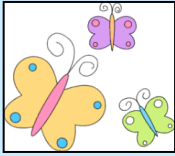

I knew that I lived in the northeast for a reason . . . the changing seasons! From snow to mud, from mud to green, then onto those beautiful colorful leaves in the fall. We've made it through the coldest winter we've had in a while and are finally moving into spring. Finally.

Let's start with a little recap. We've had our share of snow, including the 18-inch snow storm, the largest since 2022. We've also had several water main breaks, and a December filled with all of those pesky little storms. As we look toward spring, we can finally think about getting out and cleaning up our yards, and swapping out our winter tires for the summer ones.

Brush and Branch pickup will begin on Mon., April 6 and end on Fri., May 1st. There's no need to call in your sticks. We'll be cruising the town several times a week, looking for those piles. Just remember . . . when May 1st is over, so is our brush and branch pickup. (See details at the bottom.)

We'll be starting road work soon. I ask that everyone slow down when approaching and passing work crews. There always seems to be a handful of drivers who don't respect work crews and pass with reckless abandon. Please be safe on the roads, wherever you may be.

Finally, April is National Safe Digging Month. It doesn't matter what you are digging for, whether it be planting a new tree, extending a garden, adding a new fence or deck, it is the law that you notify <https://udignity.org/> or call 811 two days in advance to place your location request. A utility locator will come and mark the underground utilities. This helps keep our vital buried utilities from being damaged. Thanks, everyone! We'll talk again in the summer.

TREE BRANCH & BRUSH PICKUP: MON., APRIL 6 THRU FRI., MAY 1st



The Town of Binghamton Highway Dept. will begin picking up branches on Monday, April 6 and will end on Friday, May 1. This pickup is for TREE BRANCHES ONLY. No cuttings from any kind of bush. Due to the overwhelming response to this service, you will not be given a specific day or time when your tree branches will be picked up; simply place your pile at the curb or edge of the road. **CALL ONLY IF YOU HAVE A LARGE PILE THAT NEEDS TO BE APPROVED.** Our number is (607) 669-4323.

There are certain guidelines to be followed:

- Tree branches from your yard only; no cuttings from any kind of bushes.
- Put branches neatly along the curb/roadside in front of your home.
- Please place the large end of the branch towards the road, and leave the branches as long as possible. No piles that look like pickup sticks.
- No brush from clearing your lot.
- No brush from contractors or landscapers. (This means if you hire someone to maintain your lawn, they need to dispose of the debris; we will not take it.)
- Large piles must be approved.

The following items **WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED** and will be left behind: tree trunks; roots of any sort; clippings from lawns, flower beds, or vegetable gardens; thorny brush and small twigs; leaves and animal waste.

A DOG RUNNING AT LARGE COULD BE A COSTLY MISTAKE.



This is a friendly reminder that if I pick up your dog when it's running at large and find that it has no ID and is not licensed, I'll take it to the Broome County Humane Society. In order to retrieve your dog from the shelter, you'll not only have the fees of licensing your dog and getting a rabies vaccination for your dog (if it doesn't have one), you'll also be charged an additional \$50 seizure fee from the Town then another \$50 sheltering fee for sheltering your dog at the Humane Society. If your dog is picked up and taken to the shelter, it could be very costly to redeem it. Please license your dog to avoid the extra fees.

We want to remind all current participants in the Low-Income Senior Program and those who will be turning 65 in 2026 who may qualify for the Senior Exemption next year to **PLEASE KEEP YOUR 2025 TAX RETURN IN A SAFE PLACE.** Keep it accessible because eligible residents will need to bring it with them for processing their new Low-Income Senior Exemption for 2027.

Also, keep an eye on the mail in the fall as your annual renewal form will be mailed out at that time. Again, you'll be required to bring in your **2025 Income Tax Return for 2027.** Having the required tax return will help process your application quickly.

NOTE: You do not need to renew Enhanced Star. If you are turning 65 and have the Basic Star, the State will notify you if you qualify for the Enhanced Star. You don't need to apply. Thank you and enjoy the Spring!

Here's a quick review of dog license registrations in the Clerk's office:

The "Notice of Renewal" will be mailed to you in the beginning of the registration month.

There will be no more REMINDER letters mailed.

On the last day of the month, if you have not registered your dog, a late notice will be mailed to you. Please adhere to the late fee billing schedule that will be included with your second notice. The late fee schedule is as follows:

If the renewal is not paid within 30 days after the initial due date - \$10 late fee

If the renewal is not paid within 60 days after the initial due date - \$20 late fee

If the renewal is not paid within 90 days after the initial due date - \$30 late fee

NOTE: These fees are in addition to the standard licensing fee.

With warmer weather approaching, I'm sure many of you are thinking about cleaning up your yards. This is a friendly reminder that state, county, and local laws prohibit the open burning of any refuse, garbage, or yard waste. In other words, you cannot burn piles of leaves, grass, or other garden debris. The Broome County Sanitary Code requirements are actually stricter than those of state regulations and these requirements apply in ALL rural areas of Broome County, including the Town of Binghamton. In addition, the Town of Binghamton has a "no burn" policy, but a small fire pit may be used for recreational fires (such as hot dog roasts). A "fire pit" is described as one that has been purchased or contained by brick or cinder block, and cannot be larger than 3' in diameter.

NOTE: If the smoke from your fire pit becomes bothersome to your neighbors, they have every right to call the Broome County Sheriff's Dept. at 778-1911 or NYSDEC at 1-800-847-7332 to complain. If the Sheriff's Dept. or DEC responds, you may be hit with a very hefty fine, so use extreme caution not to aggravate your neighbors.

Finally, this is a reminder that most building projects require a permit. You can obtain a permit on the Town's website at www.townofbinghamton.com and click on "Building Codes & Permits" or you can stop into the Town Hall (they're in the FORMS rack in the foyer). If you have any questions before starting your project, feel free to call or send an email to our office. You can even submit your building permit through email, if you'd like. Thanks everyone, and enjoy the spring.

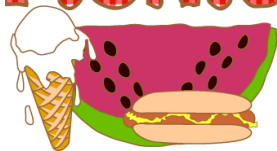

Basketball season wrapped up in February. This season we participated in a new youth basketball program, the Greater Broome County Youth Athletic Conference (GBCYAC). This league is built around the core principles of learning, coaching, and ensuring a positive experience for every player. The teams participating in both girls' and boys' divisions are from Chenango Forks, Chenango Valley, Kirkwood, Whitney Point, Windsor, and Susquehanna Valley.



This season we joined forces with the Town of Conklin to make it a true SV youth program for our kids in grades 3-6. As a result, we had 66 boys on seven teams and 48 girls on six teams. For the third season, the K-2 program was held at the SV high school and run by the boys' and girls' varsity coaching staff. This program encompasses all kids in the school district and teaches them the basic skills of the game as well as some early Saber pride! After the "regular season," an extended competitive season was played that also included boys and girls in the 2nd grade.



At the conclusion of basketball season, we moved right into baseball and softball. In addition to Tee Ball, we have baseball and softball players playing at three different levels: Pony League, Minors and Majors. The teams practice through April with games beginning April 30th. The season runs through May into early June. We continue to play baseball in our Tri-Town League with Conklin and Kirkwood. Our Quad-Town Softball League includes Windsor. This season's Opening Ceremonies and Picture Day will take place at Jackson Park on Saturday, May 2nd.
